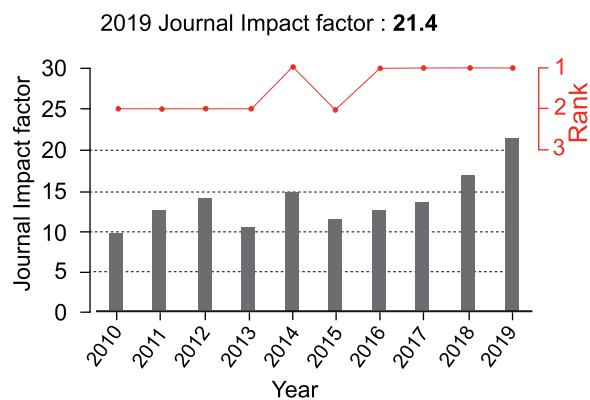


Figure 1. Journal Impact Factor and rank in category during the past 10 years (data from Journal Citation Reports).
